

Contra Costa County 2024 Mock Trial Rules for Courtroom Journalists

- You must be affiliated with a participating Contra Costa County Mock Trial team and enrolled at the team's school. You are considered to be a team member.
- You may only watch and report on your own team's trials during the preliminary rounds.
- Once seated, you may not have any contact with anyone from your school.
- You will have until 5 p.m. on the day following the trial to complete your article and email it to the Contra Costa County Office of Education (CCCOE).
- You must write the article completely by yourself.
- Articles are limited to 500 words. Use of dictionaries, thesauruses and spell checkers are permitted.
- Contestants may refer to the Mock Trial case materials, the Journalism Contest rules, and the judging criteria during the contest.
- Two winners of the journalism contest will be eligible to participate in the journalism contest at the state Mock Trial competition if their school is registered with the state.
- Awards for the Journalism Contest are independent of the CCC Mock Trial competition; an individual may win a journalism award regardless of their Mock Trial team's ranking.
