How have Hispanic and Latino individuals and groups contributed to the history and culture of California and the US?



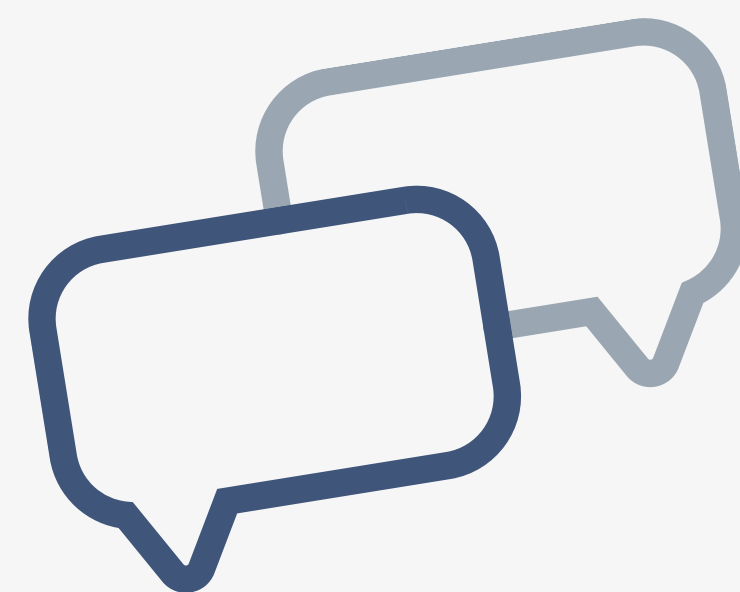
